


TIVILIA How many

Play this money-changing game to help your child learn about coin values and practice counting.

(20 pennies, 15 nickels, 10 dimes, and 4. Fquarters)



The object of the game is to end up with the most quarters. Start with the coins in a pile, and take turns tossing the die to find out how many pennies to take. If a player rolls a four, for example, he gets four pennies.

Quickly, the money changing will begin. When your youngster has five pennies, have him exchange them for a nickel. When he gets two nickels, he can trade them for a dime. Two dimes and a nickel can be swapped for a quarter.

Continue playing until no quarters remain in the pile. The player with the most quarters wins.♥

Also. try playing up to a dollar play for a certain time Devide and see what player has the most money.
